The war memorial for Hednesford was unveiled in 1922. The design of the memorial was the work of the Duke of Westminster's head gardener. It is approximately 8.5m high and bears a bronze inverted sword with sprays of olive and palm. At its base are four bronze laurel wreaths that are inscribed with the names of 234 men who fell during the Great War. In later years a further stone plaque was added at the base of the memorial to commemorate those who died during the Second World War and the Korean War.

In the run up to the annual Remembrance Sunday service that takes place at the War memorial, C & D Restoration Limited were commissioned by Hednesford Town Council to conserve, restore and clean the granite structure as well as the bronze decoration and lead inscriptions.

A new bronze plaque was placed at the entrance to the area marking the councils approval of our work.
